Minutes of the Annual General Meeting Held on 4th May 2010 Hove Methodist Hall, Hove.

1. Remembering David Miles

Colin and David Gerrard both spoke warmly about David Miles and this was followed by a slide show of 39 of David's images that he particularly liked.

3. Minutes of the AGM of 5th May 2009 and Matters arising: The minutes were agreed as a correct record.

4. 119th Report to Committee (President's Review of the Season)

Colin Miller read his report to the Committee....

"We are all justly proud of the success of this club. We continue to be successful in getting acceptances at prestigious exhibitions such as the London Salon, members are doing well in important national competitions, and a significant number have been awarded an RPS distinction this year. The quality and range of work in this club never ceases to amaze me, whatever the style of the photography. But perhaps even more importantly there continues to be a strong culture in the club that encourages and celebrates innovation and experiment.

We should also be proud of the way the club is organised, almost every external speaker has been very impressed with our display and projection systems, and how many other clubs can boast a permanent rolling exhibition at one of the most important public performance venues in the city?

I am proud of our club's culture that of encouraging and supporting all members to reach their full potential as photographers, we do this through our competitions system, the talks we organise, our workshops, the distinctions group and the entry group, and equally in the conversations we have over a pint or during the tea break.

And people continue to want to join us; we have a membership of over 150 people with something like 50 people on our waiting list.

I think we have also been pretty successful in the way we organise ourselves, we have a new constitution that, whilst not perfect (what constitution is) is certainly better than what we had before. We also have a new committee that is hard working and deeply committed to helping take the club forward, and, of course, a group of volunteers whose work makes this club possible. I make no apologies about constantly banging on about how this club would be nothing without their unstinting and enthusiastic work. And this includes everything, from making sure the tea is made, to setting things up and taking it down, running the web site, sorting out the exhibitions, organising the summer programmes and the treasure hunt and everything else. The job of organising the club programme is particularly demanding, but this year we have had some outstanding evenings. Unfortunately they often seemed to be on a night I could not make! So I have stopped asking 'how was last week' as the reply invariably was, 'you should have been there it was terrific, one of the best for years' with Miss Aniela being a particularly big hit. For me, the most successful evenings are those where the photographer has helped me think about and influenced my work and Hugh Milsom certainly affected me and I think others that way.

The club has also faced a number of important challenges, for example the hall - it's not that good really is it - and those chairs! But next season we are moving to the larger and more comfortable hall, with softer chairs. Also the meeting space for the entry group, workshops and distinction evening has been awful. I'd be the first to say that our new members in particular have not been served well this year, but I am pleased to say that we have done something about this and have booked our old venue, the English Language Centre. This means that next season we will have more comfortable surroundings where we can store separate display equipment and so on and really begin to organise things more professionally.

In my view our main challenge remains the unprecedented growth in our membership numbers. Those of us who have been a member of this club for several years are acutely aware of how this club is changing. When I joined only about 30 or so people regularly attended the Tuesday meetings and there were only about eight new members in the entry group. You could enter three pictures on a competition nights and we didn't take over the entire pub on a Tuesday evening.

Success comes at a price and I know that some members miss the old, more intimate days. They also miss the opportunity of being able to show more of their work in club in competitions. In the past the club functioned on a much more informal basis and so on but as we have grown we have had to change. Actually I think we still manage to remain a friendly and inviting club but we can't rely on this automatically happening and the bigger the membership the harder this becomes.

So we face a challenge, people continue wanting to join an already big club. As far as I can tell the demand will continue into the foreseeable future. So we face a deeply important challenge that will shape the future of the club over the next few years, how should we respond to this unprecedented demand?

Of course there is always the option of closing our doors, but this wont make the demand go away and the lifeblood of a club like ours is new members. So I am throwing out this question to every club member, what can we do to organise things differently so that, ideally, we can continue to welcome new members but also maintain the friendly open and supportive atmosphere that has been such a key reason for remaining a member of this club.

Finally, on a personal note I just want to say a huge thank you to our committee members for their hard work, support and enthusiasm, I particularly want to thank our outgoing membership secretary, Maggie and our treasurer Ken. Ken’s hard work in looking after the club finances over the years, his council, clear and up to date information, support and steady hand has played a critically important role in helping us take things forward. Whilst Maggie’s work as membership secretary has ensured that new members and prospective are properly informed, get their membership packs and are properly welcomed to the club.”

7. Treasurer's Interim Report

(Balance sheet shown as Appendix 1)

There is still some remaining income/expenditure, probably in the region of £400, but some of this may not be incurred until the next financial year. Committee members were consulted by by e-mail concerning subs for next year. The majority favoured keeping the subs at their current rate.

Ken therefore recommended that subs should be maintained at the current level for 2010/2011.

From September the Club will be able to accept standing orders/direct debits for subscriptions. Any members wishing to set these up must do so through their own bank. They will need to know the details of the Club's account. A form will be sent out with the renewal packs.

Member subs have increased by £1,028 mainly due to the increase in membership, which stands at 152. This year 26 members did not renew but 54 joined.

Canteen: surplus of £200 inc. small profit on Christmas event.

Rent: paid to the end of April. As far as we are aware there is no increase in rent for the new hall. However the Church has increased rent by 5% p.a. for the last two years. We are also committed to use the English Language Centre for Thursday activities. This will cost approx. double the amount we have paid for accommodation for workshops, E

Group & Committee meetings. A rough estimate is £180 increase, but Committee has agreed to charge £3 for workshops (not E Group meetings) which will defray the cost.

Speakers and assessors cost £310 less this year. At a time of rising costs this reflects the hard work put in by the Programme Team.

Exhibitions last year showed a deficit of £927. The current surplus of £552 is largely due to the success of the Old Market 'rolling' exhibition. Again a tribute to the organisers and to the members who have supported it with their work.

Capital expenditure mainly new frames. Boxes for storage still to be purchased.

Refunds(exp.) mainly the refund to the National Lottery.

Donation of £100 to St Peter & St James Hospice, Hassocks. David Miles' family had requested no flowers at the funeral but requested that donations be given to the Hospice. Committee agreed to send a cheque for £100.

Insurance has risen as the amount of equipment belonging to the Club has increased, mainly through the purchase of equipment with the Lottery Grant.

Finally, as the Co Op Bank insist on a Club resolution for any change to Club signatories Ken proposed the following resolution:-

This Club agrees to continue its arrangements with the Co-operative Bank for Community Business Account No.63361661 in accordance with the Bank's conditions.

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This resolution was seconded by Bob Webzell and was unanimously carried with no abstentions.
